- 5. Simultaneous submissions (papers already submitted to other conferences/journals) are not allowed.
- 6. The Plagiarism must not exceed the limit of 15% including References.
- 7. The organizing committee reserves the right to accept or reject the paper at its discretion.
- 8. Kindly send your Full-length paper to nciipa2025@gmail.com. Those who do not adhere to the submission guidelines will be rejected.
- 9. Registration fees is INR 1000/- for Academicians / Industry Professionals and INR 500/- for students. This is inclusive of the Convention kit, high tea and lunch during breaks for both days.
- 10. Participants from areas other than Delhi/ NCR would be allowed to present their papers through the online mode.
