This study explores why South Korea's top leadership

The authors argue that (a) South Korea's top leadership utilized region-based particularistic elements to secure loyalty to the authoritarian leader and (b) state bureaucrats fell back on the readily available social resources of the time--informal social ties--to reduce the uncertainty innate to policy implementation and to achieve short-term policy goals, and this practice bred the organizational foundation that might undermine the bureaucratic character of the state--legalism and impersonalism--at the later stage of economic development. - Reproduced.

Andhra Pradesh, unlike state like Kerala, West Bengal, Madhya Pradesh and Karnataka is lagging behind in activating the decentralized planning process. Although AP Government has passed Conformity Act as soon as 73rd Constitutional Amendment Act was enacted, most of the provisions of the Andhra Pradesh Conformity Act have not been made into concrete reality even today i.e., more than after a decade and half of decentralization experience is Andhra Pradesh. The functional devolution states of Andhra Pradesh as compared to some of the well performing states make it clear that AP has not done well in developing functions, finances and functionaries envisaged in the 11th Schedule of the Constitution. Andhra Pradesh Government, despite its prolonged commitment to strengthen planning process, has finally brought the District Planning Act, 2005. However, the guidelines of the working of the DPCs have yet to be formulated to make these institutions functional. Our article addresses overview of decentralization status in AP in general and decentralized planning process in particular. - Reproduced.

Amidst all significant changes taking place in school education since the few decades in India, the most discussed topic of national importance has been the planning for a more contextual, practical, and application oriented curriculum. In this context, the significance of safety education has been realized very late towards the end of the last decade after a serious of devastating disasters affected school sector in India. To promote disaster safety education, CBSE incorporated disaster management as a front line curriculum at secondary and higher secondary level of education gradually from 2003. While the curriculum at standard VIII focused mainly on preparedness measures, IX emphasised on mitigation measures, and X highlighted roles of different stakeholders and role of science and technology. Similarly, at standard XI level, the focus was on cross cutting and community issues. Subsequent to CBSE, more than 13 education boards followed the suit in

integrating disaster education as a part of school curriculum mostly at secondary and higher secondary levels. Following its opening to trade and foreign investment in the mid-1980s, Mexico's economic growth has been modest at best, particularly in comparison with that of China. Comparing these countries and reviewing the literature, we conclude that the relation between openness and growth is not a simple one. Using standard trade theory, we find that Mexico has gained from trade, and by some measures, more so than China. We sketch out a theory in which developing countries can grow faster than the United States by reforming. As a country becomes richer, this sort of catch-up becomes more difficult. Absent continuing reforms, Chinese growth is likely to slow down sharply, perhaps leaving China at a level less than Mexico's real GDP per working-age person.
