Between 1996 and 2011, 15 American states enacted legislation to implement either mandatory or optional defined contribution accounts for certain public employees. What drove this process? This article investigates the role of political, budgetary, and contagion influences on the diffusion of defined contribution accounts for general state employees. Empirical results suggest that enactments were influenced by Republican legislative, but not executive, partisanship. Gains in state indebtedness also increased the likelihood of enactment independent of political and other factors. There is no evidence of policy learning based on neighboring state activity and no influence from two measures of organized labor power. Through different forms of decentralization variables, this study investigates Indonesian local government

authorities' 2006 financial accountability reports in terms of local government authorities' contributing funds to political parties. Audit results by the Supreme Audit Body reveal that many articles were violated by these authorities in regard to the distributing, administrating, and reporting of assistance funds from them to political parties. Each rupiah committed by the 221 local government authorities involved in this study violated, on average, 1.8 articles, indicating a low level of compliance.

Critically, the study finds that administrative, fiscal, and political decentralization decreases discrepancies. The less administratively decentralized provincial authorities, where decision making is a level of government farther from the people, are more likely than non-provincial local government authorities to make discrepancies with political party legislation and regulations. Fiscally decentralized local government authorities, who earn a higher fraction of their revenue from local sources, also tend to have fewer discrepancies. Once we abandon the false theoretical premise of welfare economics that past period's goods and services are available in the current period as well, a number of seemingly contradictory bits of evidence on the measurement and level of poverty in India fall into place and gel into a coherent story. When poverty is defined in terms of access to a bundle of goods and services, which includes a minimum number of calories, there can be little doubt that poverty has been increasing in neoliberal India.

The interim report of the Supreme Court-appointed Technical Expert Committee (TEC) on genetically modified (GM) crops, which was submitted in late 2012, provides yet more evidence of the urgent need for effective communication between natural and social scientists. The polarisation of perceptions has posed serious questions about the role of biotechnology (read science) with regard to our agricultural crops (read society). However, the efforts for reconciliation are not discernible. In fact, the TEC's report is not the first one articulating the collective understanding and approach towards genetic manipulation. With a narrow narrative, the questions on social and economic relevance of biotechnology sound far more amplified. The report has come at a time, as critics point out, when the nation is still grappling with the moratorium on Bt brinjal, which de facto engulfed the full stream of crops awaiting approval for commercialisation. - Reproduced.
