**In this article, the intellectual thought of a group of key late 19th century national administrative reformers is isolated and analyzed. These reformers were interested in reforming the civil, military and business administrative functions of the executive branch to provide for greater elite administrative supervision over and intervention in the national society and economy. the reformers often articulated their reform purposes, motives and goals in the Hamiltonian language of administrative authority and popular defence to executive administrative counsels. An important key to understanding this article is recognizing that while environmental social and economic conditions had changed significantly for the Glided Age reformers since the American constitutional founding, many elements of the Hamiltonian tradition still resonated with the reformers a full century later. **transmitted ideology and rhetoric of Hamiltonian thought can be seen as having an independent, causative impact on the administrative reformers' purposes, motives and goals related to executive administrative reform. - Reproduced.**

**Most models and empirical tests of the relationship between corruption and democracy assume corruption falls as democracy matures.
