1.	<p>Prof. K.K. Pandey</p> <p>I just wanted to make 2 or 3 important points which relate to the performance and struggle that Institute has undergone during last couple of years. There has been a resource crunch after the withdrawal of two third of grant by DoPT. This put enormous pressure on faculty and the Institute. The Institute mobilized two third money to sustain with great difficulty. Faculty goes to field, they stay in the cheapest accommodation, not the accommodation which is earmarked in the proposal. So, we do lot of savings, then we somehow are able to mobilize the requisite funds. For this effort, Director who is heading the faculty and staff need special appreciation that Institute has been able to sustain during last couple of years and the deficit also has been minimized to Rs.70 Lakhs from couple of crores, yet challenges are very wide. We do not get faculty and staff, the due perks and amenity which even as per the Sixth Pay Commission, there are certain things, Institute is not in a position to give. Even tomorrow there may be a problem of pension. There is no medical facility available after retirement, so all these things need resources, financial resources. At the same time challenges are also widening, scope of work is fairly wide, governance, administration, new public management are posing challenge to do more research and training to the Institute. And in this context we have to either change, recently the noble prize for literature has been given to Bob Dylan and his one important poem is very much appropriate for IIPA in which he says either change along with time or disappears like stone. So, we have to either change, IIPA has to either change or time will not remember. In that context, what we have to do, we have to</p>	<p>Observations are well taken. The Institute is trying to maximize and mobilize financial resources. We are doing more number of training programmes now. The fee from the training programmes has increased from Rs.6.26 crores (2015-16) to Rs.8.57 crores (2016-17). Similarly our faculty are taking up larger number of research projects now. Around 37 research projects are currently being done in IIPA which is a big jump from previous years. Our faculty are working tirelessly to catapult IIPA in the national as well as international arena also. We have minimized our deficit further to Rs.65 lakhs now. Pension is now being disbursed to retired employees without any hindrance. IIPA is trying very hard to extend medical facility also to its retired employees, atleast the OPD part, within its limited resources.</p> <p>Some of the Regional/Local Branches are indeed performing very well and the Executive Council may take a decision regarding institution of award to best performing Regional Branch as well as best performing Local Branch on an annual basis.</p> <p>IIPA is trying very hard to strengthen its links with the DoPT, in particular and Government in general. It is heartening to know that IIPA is now being treated at par with LBSNAA, Mussoorie and ISTM, New Delhi in all the meetings and communications of the DoPT.</p>

	<p>mobilize necessary resources, we have to do more research, for that we need more faculty, for more faculty we need more funds. And the space which is available to us, should be utilized as per optimum potential. This area, this plot falls within 1000 square meters of the Metro, so the extra FSI is given by government, by Delhi government and that can be utilized to raise more resources.</p> <p>Regional Branches today in the morning showed keen interest in the development of the Institute and there are certain regional branches which are doing exemplary work particularly Jammu & Kashmir, Karnataka, Maharashtra and Tamil Nadu and other regional branches and local branches should learn from each other. What I will suggest, we will give awards, we should also give best performing regional branch award each year and best performing local branch award. And we should then disseminate that this local branch and this regional branch doing A to Z activities, so that others learn. We are here to learn and third last point I want to make is that our link with the government. Although they are giving one third money but many projects we get on single quotation. We get on our links with the government, so we have to see how our links with the DoPT, with the Government of India can be strengthened further. What can be the institutional arrangement? So, that our link with the government are more and more beneficial to us.</p>	
2.	<p>Prof. V.K. Sharma</p> <p>I have just two points to raise. I fully agree with Prof. Pandey what he said. There are ample opportunities with the IIPA which we can explore. For example, I will tell you and for your knowledge this Institute in last couple of years organized more than 50 programs for the following countries or neighboring countries and in November first week we have another program for women of Afghanistan. 3.	<p>Shri R. Krishna Reddy</p> <p>At the outset, I congratulate the Chairman, Director and other authorities who are involved in the presentation of Annual Accounts for the year 2015-16 in a systematic way and wiping out of another Rs.1.09 crores of deficit budget and also Rs.3 crores during the year 2014-2015. I would like to focus certain points noticed in various financial statements. Pages 102 to 141 in the Annual Accounts for the year 2015-16. In previous years the Institute earned Rs.17.43 crores rupees as against the expenditure of Rs.14.48 crores leaving surplus of Rs.2.95 crores. And the total income from the internal resources from Rs.13.59 crores to Rs.11.70 crores, so comparatively the income of the Institute during the year 2015-16 is decreased. The reasons for the decrease of income of the Institute may please be explained. The payment of branch promotion activities is also reduced during 2015-16. Details of particulars of payment of Rs.1.09 crores to CGHS to be furnished. This is on page number 116 of Schedule A. The process pertaining to reconciliation work of discrepancy of Rs.114 lakhs between the gross value of fixed assets and assets physically valued still pending. This work needs to be completed soon and amount of Rs.12.48 lacs should be recovered from</p>	<p>The decrease in income from internal resources has been mainly on account of decrease in training fee and income from research projects in the year 2015-16. The Institute shifted to accrual based accounting from the year 2012-13. There were a large number pending payments of training programmes which were done earlier and which came to knowledge after shifting to accrual based accounting. As such conscious efforts were made for recovery of this pending amounts which largely fructified in the year 2014-15. As such fee from training programmes jumped abruptly in the year 2014-15. It is evident if it is compared with the fee from the training programmes of the year 2013-14 which was only Rs.3.88 crores. As such, the decrease in income from training programmes is only notional for the year 2015-16 if seen in the light of the years 2014-15 and 2013-14. Similarly there was a decrease in the income from research projects in the year 2015-16 compared to that with the year 2014-15 as many research projects which were undertaken were not closed by the end of the year 2015-16 and their net savings could not be taken into account.</p> <p>Branches promotion activities was not reduced during the year 2015-16. On the contrary, Branches received a</p>

<p>employees before at least end of the financial year. Actions may please be initiated to recover Rs.6.87 lacs from the income tax authorities and also to liquidate the opening balance of Rs.45.49 lacs and Rs.52.88 lacs at the earliest. Serious efforts should be initiated by the management of IIPA to recover an amount of Rs.217 lacs deposited by NIDM to the central government in accordance with the provisions of 20% Central Government as rental agreement, it all financial transactions especially amount of depositor shall be weak pan. In violation to the norms, TDS be deducted its source, the total recoverable amount of TDS may be reflected in the statement. An upto date fixed assets register to be maintained as per GFR rules. An upto date register showing the interest accrued on all investments, funds, grants, deposits to be maintained so as to enable the Institute to utilize such amount whenever any need arises. Lastly in my opinion, the constitution hype over periodic committee to be constituted to recommend modifications, omissions, commissions, errors in the account statement if necessary and also suggests measures to maintain financial system of the Institute.</p>	<p>total of Rs.9.58 lakhs from IIPA, New Delhi (page no.92 of Annual Report 2015-16) as compared to Rs.7.01 lakhs in the year 2014-15.</p> <p>The Hon'ble Member has mentioned that a payment of Rs.1.09 crores was made to CGHS during the year 2015-16 as mentioned in page no.116. However, on scrutiny of page no.116, it is evident that a payment of only Rs.19.45 lakhs has been made to CGHS and not a huge amount of Rs.1.09 crores. Reconciliation of the physical assets is a very time taking and cumbersome process. However, the point is well taken and efforts will be made in this direction. Substantial recoveries have been made for advances to employees and the pending amount has come down from Rs.12.45 lakhs (2015-16) to Rs.5.37 lakhs only in the year 2016-17. The complete recovery of Rs.6.87 lakhs from Income Tax has been made and no previous amount is pending to be recovered from Income Tax Department. Efforts have been made to liquidate the opening balance of a total of Rs.98.37 lakhs and the opening balance now is only Rs.73.89 lakhs. NIDM is also an organization of Govt. of India, Ministry of Home Affairs. IIPA has requested them for releasing the 20% amount to IIPA as early as possible. IIPA is now collecting the PAN numbers from the service providers religiously and releasing the payment only after deducting proper TDS. IIPA has fixed assets as per GFR provisions. The Auditors observation is only that it needs to be updated continuously which IIPA is doing. IIPA maintains all the financial transactions including investments etc. in a robust tally system and all the information is available in it. Also the complete details of investments in tabular is also available in our annual accounts which is a part of Annual Report.</p>

4.	<p>Dr. Ghanshyam N. Singh</p> <p>I would like to comment the present compensation for correcting the derailed democratic system in the Institute. We were there to pilot whatever unethical treatment. Unethical practices were going on and I am really very happy and I think the whole house is here, they subscribe my view that well the system has been, the derailed system can be corrected and it should be strengthening further. This is all that it requires that election process that I am addressing too and now come to the membership issue has been raised many times. We find lots of applications for membership are there which are pending and in the meeting of office bearers with two types of suggestion were made, one to expand the membership and other is that the membership should be channelized through local or regional branches. To me it appears that it is the requirement of the time that first backlog pending applications for the membership should be clear. I understand I have got a list of a dozen persons, very senior teachers, administrator, their applications are pending here. So, it is better to address that which is very important, meaning thereby you just clear the backlog and then go ahead. Regional Branches are having their representation in the Executive Council but Local Branches are not having their representation because they are grass root organizations, the lowest of legislation that you are having. So if you don't give the representation of the grass root of legislation, your organization will not be a representative one. So, to me it appears that if you are tall and you want to. Now the very important issue that expulsion, some members were expelled from the membership because of their unethical practices. I don't, I subscribe the view well. It was right that some of the persons were involved, who involved themselves in unethical practices, they should be expelled and they should not come to this</p>	<p>Noted.</p> <p>Moratorium on new membership was applied in view of consolidation of existing membership records. As there is a stay on E.C. elections imposed by the Hon'ble High Court of Delhi, IIPA is not in a position to open new membership now since members are voters also. Pending judgement on E.C. elections, opening new membership would be tantamount to updating and changing the electoral roll. As such, a decision on opening new membership can be taken only after the order of Hon'ble High Court regarding elections.</p>

5.	<p>Dr. Parvinder Kaushal</p> <p>I am giving my suggestions and comments on the Annual Report. Item No.305.5 Removal of members in arrears for more than two years (2015 & 2016) from the roll of membership of the Institute under Rule 35(1).

Rule 35(1) of the rules of the Institute provides that **'the name of any member whose subscription falls in arrears for more than two years shall be removed from the Roll of Members of the Institute unless the Executive Council decide otherwise'**.

As per our records, there are 118 Annual Members and 12 Corporate (Annual) Members who have yet to renew their subscription in spite of efforts to persuade them to renew their subscription. As we have not received the membership subscription from these defaulting members, as such it is proposed that the names of such members may be removed from the roll of membership under Rule 35(1) of the Rules of the Institute. The list of defaulting Annual and Corporate Members is enclosed. **(Annexure-A)**

In addition to the above, 95 Corporate Members admitted for 20 years period long back have not renewed their membership for the last so many years despite of efforts to persuade them to renew their subscription. As such, it is proposed that the names of 95 Corporate Members (20 years) may be removed from the roll of membership. The list of defaulting Corporate Members is enclosed. **(Annexure-B)**

Item No.305.10 Items to Report:

(i) MoU between DoPT and IIPA.

As per General Financial Rules, an autonomous organization with a budgetary support of more than Rupees five crores per annum is required to enter Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with Administrative Ministry or Department. As IIPA is receiving grant of more than Rs. 5.00 Crore per year from DoPT. DoPT has been insisting for signing of MoU with IIPA as per the Ministry of Finance OM No.26(5)/EMC Cell/2016 dated 21/04/2017, no grant shall be released by the Govt. if the MoU is not signed. As such, IIPA has consented to the MoU sent by DoPT after due approval of the Competent Authority.

Matter is put up to EC for kind information.

(ii) Opening of separate Savings Bank Account for Research Projects.

The sponsoring agencies of various research projects are now insisting for opening of separate Savings Account for their project. It has now become a norm in the Government. IIPA is now continuously facing this problem for research projects.

As such, it is proposed that a policy for opening of separate savings bank accounts for Research Projects, if insisted by the sponsoring agency, may be approved. The Savings Account will be opened on need basis for any Project in the UCO Bank, IIPA Branch with the normal operators for the account i.e. Dy. Registrar, Registrar, Director and Treasurer/Designated E.C. members. One Saving Account for Capacity Building Strategies for Climate Change Project has been recently opened in UCO Bank, IIPA Branch after it was insisted by the National Mission on Himalayan Studies (NMHS) that no money would be released if a separate account for this project was project. The matter is submitted for rectification of the Executive Council.

(iii) Nomination of new Chairman of Odisha Regional Branch.

IIPA Odisha Regional Branch in its AGM held on 26.5.2017 elected Dr. Ajit Kumar Tripathy, former Chief Secretary Odisha as new Chairman of the Branch in place of Shri B.B. Mishra whose terms expire. The Chairman, Odisha Regional Branch is a Member of the Executive Council.

(iv) Status report on updation of the membership records and preparation of the “Tentative Electoral Roll/Voters List”.

As per decision taken by the Executive Council in its 301st meeting held on 11th April, 2016, we have sent a communication dated 19.5.2016 to all 11,349 Annual/Life Members by Regd. Post/Speed Post to ascertain their option for election methodology as well as to update their contact details, format for updation of contact details along with the pre-paid return envelope was sent to members along with the letter. This letter was in continuation of several other circulars requesting members to update their contact details, which were widely publicized on IIPA website, IIPA Newsletter along with communication to Regional/Local Branches for wider publicity. The letter dated 19.5.2016 was also widely publicized by putting it on IIPA website, Newsletter, sending to Regional/Local Branches etc.

Subsequently as decided by the E.C. in its meeting held on 5th August, 2016, one month more time was given to members for updation of their contact details by publicizing the notice again through IIPA website, Newsletter and writing to Regional/Local Branches along with list of those members who have not responded to the letter dated 19.5.2016. The letter clearly emphasized that *“it will not be possible to include the names of such members in the electoral roll, if their response is not received”*.

As on date, IIPA has a total membership of 11245 (Life/Annual). However, there are 6979 active members (as per the decision taken by the E.C. in 2003) whom regular communications like AGM Notice, Annual Report etc. are sent from time to time.

In response to the communications mentioned above, a total of 2655 members have responded with their contact details.

Out of the 3111 returned undelivered letters on various accounts, 274 letters returned with the remarks “addressee expired/deceased”. Regional/Local Branches had also been requested to verify/confirm this list. However, not many branches have taken interest in this except only a few. Reconciling the branches report with the list of 274 members, a list of 255 members has been prepared who may have expired (**Annexure-I**).

The Hon’ble High Court of Delhi, in the W.P.(C) 9704/2016, has given the interim order as below:

“It is directed that any decision on Agenda No.15 taken by the respondent no.1 shall be subject to further orders of this Court. The methodology for conducting elections

as discussed and decided by the General Body shall also be placed before the Court and shall not be implemented till further orders of this Court.”

As per the Hon’ble Court’s interim order, all the proceedings and decision of the General Body in its meeting held on 21st October, 2016, regarding the methodology for future elections to the Executive Council have been placed before the Hon’ble High Court well in time.

In view of the Hon’ble High Court’s interim order above, future election to the E.C. can now be held only after the Hon’ble Court gives a decision in the W.P.(C) 9704/2016 regarding the election methodology.

As such, the status report was submitted to the Chairman, IIPA and he had directed that tentative electoral roll/voters list be put up on IIPA website inviting any objections within two months.

Accordingly, a circular dated 16.08.2017 along with list of 2655 members as “Tentative Electoral Roll/Voters List” for future E.C. election has been put on IIPA website inviting any objections within two months from the members. The matter is reported to the Executive Council.

A list of 255 deceased members is annexed and the E.C. may decide whether we may remove their names from the membership records. **(Annexure-I)**
