He also informed the E.C. that Shri Tripathi has joined on additional charge as Director, IIPA w.e.f. 8th April 2019 alongwith continuing as Secretary, Parliamentary Affairs, Govt. of India. Due to ongoing elections, he has not been relieved from the Govt. of India.

The E.C. approved appointment of Shri S.N. Tripathi as Director, IIPA and authorized the Chairman for further action regarding his terms and conditions as Director, IIPA.

The statue may be of black marble and the total cost will be around Rs.70,000 to Rs.80,000 tentatively. The Director also conveyed that since it is a small cost, it may be met with the contributions from IIPA employees as a tribute to Father of the Nation.

The E.C. deliberated the matter and the Chairman conveyed that it is a good idea to show respect to the Father of Nation. However, he asked the Director to explore and prepare the final proposal and put up for further necessary action.

The EC appreciated the diversity of training and research as well as efforts of the faculty/staff of IIPA.

Dr. C. Chandramouli, Secretary (P) informed the E.C. that there is a provision of study leave to the Government officers if they are enrolled in academic institutions for pursuing higher studies. He suggested that IIPA may also start accepting the enrollment of Govt. officers for research purposes and the Govt. can extend the similar benefit of study leave to such officers. IIPA can award a certificate for successful completion of the research work.

The Chairman thanked the Secretary for contemplating such a proposal which is in mutual interest of IIPA as well as the Govt. The Chairman opined that this type of arrangement would catapult IIPA also in limelight and the officers will also benefit. The Director suggested that a complete work schedule may be made for the duration of attachment of the officers to IIPA including taking lectures in our training programmes. Prof. K.K. Pandey conveyed that this arrangement is very practical and workable. The Chairman requested Secretary (P) to convey approval of this proposal to IIPA as early as possible.

S.No.	Suggestions/Observations	Draft Office Replies
1.	<p>DR. N.N. MISHRA</p> <p>Regarding the feeling of the house that elections should be held in a free and fair manner, I very much feel that lingering the court case is wastage of time. Very rightly our hon. Vice-President also categorically said that we must not waste the time because time is very precious. For so many years the elections were being held very smoothly. If there was a little bit of mismanagement somewhere, it could have been managed. Everybody in the hostel where I am staying is saying that something should be done in this regard, and I am sure, something will be done in regard to electoral reform.</p> <p>Some positive things should be done for the all-round improvement of the Institute. Some more journals, some more academic exchange, some more days stay in the hostel for the persons coming here should be there. Why only five days, ten days or fifteen days or even twenty days stay can be allowed for scholars like us. I was in Kendriya Vidhyalaya Sangathan. Whenever I was coming here, I used to sit in the library and jot down. Even in the last two days also, I have been doing this.</p>	<p>As soon as the Hon'ble Court decides about the way to conduct the election and gives the order for conducting it, we will be ready for the elections.</p> <p>IIPA has been doing a huge number of academic activities nowadays. The number of training programmes and research projects being carried out by the institute has increased tremendously over the last five years. Infact, in 2017-18, IIPA conducted 104 training programmes and in 2018-19, the number jumped to 119. The number of research projects currently on, is over 40 which is a marked improvement over earlier years. The Indian Journal of Public Administration (IIPA), the flagship journal of IIPA has become now globally renowned and has acquired viewership even in USA, Canada and UK etc. Recently, IIPA has started sending its journal Documentation in Public Administration (DPA) to its members free of cost through email. Regarding the enhancement of number of days of stay in the hostel, it is informed that the rate of stay for 5 days for members is highly subsidized. Due to occupancy by trainee officers in the hostel, it has become increasingly difficult to provide even 5 days to a member in the hostel.</p>

		<p>On top of this the government has been continuously advising IIPA to enhance the rates of services to raise internal resources. The Members may be allowed to stay for another 5 days in the Hostel on double the members rate subject to availability and any emergency situation, with due approval of the Director. There is no barrier on a member for stay in excess of 5 days in the hostel on non-members rate which itself is very low, if availability is there.</p>
2.	<p>PROF. GHANSHYAM N. SINGH</p> <p>At the outset, I would like to express our gratitude to the present set up under the Chairmanship of T.N. Chaturvedi Saheb and Director and his team that they have brought a sense of sensitivity in responding to our problems and requests. I just give one example of my own; many of my other friends also might have felt like that. I was there in the hostel last time and then I found a room where something was broken. I brought it directly to the notice of the Director and when after lunch I went there, he requisitioned the contractor and all and it was repaired in no time. This speaks of the sensitivity of the man who is having the reign of administration here.</p> <p>The second point is about the system of election. I remember and my friends on the dais know that for 4-5 years we were fighting to bring a change in the electoral system because the electoral system was mismanaged. It was all in a very messy situation. For three-four years we fought for that. Then a committee was formed and then the election was annulled and the officers were de-listed. After that I found a lot of changes and, I feel, change is for the betterment. I do feel and in private conversation with Srivastavaji also, I say this. I say with great conviction that the present system is working very well and if anyone of you wants to go back to that, then for that, you have to make a very objective change of voting because earlier</p>	<p>Noted with thanks.</p> <p>Noted with thanks.</p>

we used to find that when a member was getting himself elected as a member of the Executive Council, he would bring his wife, children and all. That way, large-scale malpractices were going on. If we go back to that system, then that will be a very unfortunate situation for the Institute and for the society because IIPA has taken a new phase of development where it is bring rated very high, not just at the national but at the international level also. Many of the members in my talk with them, support my view that the present system is working very well, in a very sensitive, very organized and in a very democratic and transparent manner. Well, that is one point. Then, I would like to say a few of the things that have brought disrepute to the Institute. Well, some of my friends whom I respect very much, they know me also very well because I am a member here for so many decades. I am one of the few senior members of this institute. So, I find that the court case has brought disrepute to the Institute and before getting the case withdrawn or just repenting for the case, if we want to go back on that, then we have to wait for the decision of the court.

Now, I would like to draw your attention to some of the problems that we as members are facing. At present we have got only three days stay or five days stay at the hostel, whosoever he or she may be. Well, there may be certain circumstances whereby a member may have to stay for more than three or five days. For example, I had undergone the knee replacement. The Institute should be sensitive to its members. They may be having their medical needs also. I do not think it is just a hot spot or a club where you just come and stay. But if urgency is thee for medical need and all that, senior members should be shown some consideration. I paid nearly a lakh of rupees for my stay in the hostel here because I was in the AIIMS for my knee replacement. For that also I had to pay

It is to inform that members have the privilege of staying in the hostel for first 5 days on highly subsidized rates of Rs 500/- per day only. For the next 5 days, in case of any emergency, they can extend their stay for another 5 days on double the rate with due approval of the Director and if there is availblity in the hostel. The members should understand that IIPA is an academic institution and gets only around 40% grant from the government for its survival. It has to raise around 60% of resources through training and research. For this, IIPA has to conduct a large number of training programmes where it has to provide hostel accommodation also to its trainee officers. On top of this, IIPA has a long term liability of over Rs 97 crores on account of

	<p>that much. I understand, the Chairman of the committee which took this decision also said that this was a wrong decision. So, I request the Chairman and his team that be sensitive to your senior members. If he has got a medical problem, then, as a special case, extension should be granted for stay. If somebody produces a certificate from AIIMS and all that, then the limit for stay should be enhanced beyond three days.</p>	<p>retirement benefits to the employees. The government also is now in no mood to extend freebies to the autonomous institutions and many of the institutions are on verge of closure. IIPA is facing similar issues and it must raise resources for its sheer survival. Members must understand that IIPA can provide facilities to them only if it survives. As such, all the members of IIPA, being seasoned academicians or bureaucrats, must cooperate for survival of IIPA and not insist on extending freebies to them.</p>
3.	<p>DR. AWADHESH KUMAR SINGH</p> <p>I fully agree with the statement made by Prof. Ghanshyam Singh who has appreciated the functioning of the IIPA and endorsed it fully. One thing I have to say. The Centre for Consumer Studies has initiated capacity building and under this programme, training is given and our Branch people also have attended some training programmes here. But we want to organize training programmes in our branch also and we are capable of doing it. Some faculty members are there who have got training here. But what is the use of getting training and not doing anything for the consumer? So, we seek some assistance, financial or otherwise, to organize the training programmes and go to the people, for the people, for the consumer, to give benefit to them. <p>particularly my statement – you must have received from everybody – and in this statement, Director’s reply is also there that ‘I will discuss the matter later on with you. This is not a concern. You pass this Annual Report and then move forward’. But I have not been given time.</p> <p>Now I come to the next point. The point is that there is a report which I am going to read, ‘Report of the three-member committee constituted by the Chairman, IIPA under rule 5(22) of the Election Bylaws’. These are Committee’s recommendations. I am going to read the last three lines because I do not want to take more time -</p> <p>“We, therefore, recommend that the said election be declared null and void. The management of the IIPA may consider taking further appropriate action under rule 5(20) of the Election Bylaws in this regard.”</p> <p>There is an election bylaw. Shri Chaturvedi Ji himself was presiding over the meeting of the Executive Council. The matter was deliberately discussed and the matter was particularly discussed as a separate agenda at least for half an hour over there and then it was passed that the Executive Committee, which is the final authority, does not agreed to it, hence it could not be passed over there. Even then, in the General Assembly of 2014, the matter was put up in the agenda and I feel that the Director was there and then it was passed again. Next time again, the matter was put up in the meeting and a Special General Body Meeting was convened on the complaint of some of the members. Vice-President of India, in his Address, suggested that IIPA should do something for governance reforms, be it policy impact, assessment, evaluation etc., or for electoral reform, governance reform, how public service delivery could be expedited and could reach to every corner of India. IIPA faculty has really undertaken a number of such projects with various Ministries. But I think that the branches should also be involved in such impact assessment or policy evaluation exercises and collection of field data and all such things. It is to inform that the DoPT provides the Grant-in-aid to IIPA which is a very substantial amount and necessary for survival of IIPA. The Secretary (Personnel) is also a member of IIPA Executive Council. As such, IIPA is under obligation to follow the directions of DoPT as well as Govt of India rules. IIPA gets its business also only from Govt like Training programmes for Govt officers as well as Research Projects of Ministries. Govt. grant is absolutely necessary for survival of IIPA. The members must understand that membership will be there only if IIPA is surviving. Hundreds of Autonomous Organisations are closing down as Govt. has formulated strict policies for the Autonomous Organisations. As such, it is the interest of IIPA to stick to DoPT and not the vice-versa.

The issue of Hostel tariff has been already clarified. In the current situation when IIPA is in need of raising resources, it is absolutely not possible to reduce the hostel tariff for members. In fact, members should themselves volunteer for enhancing the hostel tariff as the present tariff is quite low as per

the location, facilities and market situations. Further, the Govt. has been asking IIPA to enhance the Hostel tariffs also which are very low. The Hostel tariff were last revised in the year 2014. It has been 5 years since the revision. In the meantime, IIPA has tried to upgrade the hostel facility by providing LED TV, AC, Heater, Geyser, Wi-Fi, Intercom with zero dialing local facility in every room. The mess facility has also been upgraded by providing complete AC system and better food/catering facility. The difference in the last 05 years is for everyone to see. However, hostel rates are still on highly lower side which need to be rationalized as compared to the facilities.

The RTIs are dealt in very timely manner and replied to. If there is any grievance, the members can always approach the Appellate Authority, the Director IIPA. If someone is still unsatisfied, she/he can approach the CIC also as per RTI rules. Once it is an RTI, it'll be dealt as per RTI rules only and the AGM is not the appropriate forum for RTI grievances.

I have not received it, many members have not received it. Please send the report in time so that we can go through it and raise our queries here. Many members have not got it. So, please send it timely.</p> <p>Then I come to bylaws. You are not following the bylaws. Clause 19 says 'Election of the President of the Institute every year to be held here'. Why don't you remove it? Please remove it. Whenever we give suggestions, they are annoyed, which is not a proper thing.</p>	<p>Replied in the meeting itself by the Chairman :</p> <p>CHAIRMAN: It is by designation only, not by name. I have seen hundreds of reports also. I will show you. It is clarified.</p> <p>The Chairman replied in the meeting itself that it is a minor issue. It will be looked into and necessary rectification would be carried out, if needed, in the next years' accounts. It is informed that the information on amendment by Income Tax Department regarding rate of depreciation on computers to 40% from earlier 60% was received late. Today there was a very happy note that the Vice-President of India, who is the President of this institute also, has shown increasing sense of rapport or the idea of consultation or the urge for consultation of the think-tank opinions of the IIPA. So, the IIPA should utilize this to the maximum, keeping an eye on public administration lacunae in the country, or, maybe, one wing here, Applied Public Administration Wing. Their job may be only to find what are the administrative lacunae or what is the failure of understanding of the spirit of that law. For example, The Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Act, as it is in place, makes human life cheaper than even rabid and terminally ill animals straying on the roads. This is very bad because we know there should be mercy towards animals and all that. But that is possible without letting the human values being subordinate to even terminally ill animals. About 50,000 people in the country die of rabies just because it is an uncontrolled animal menace on the roads. So, what our Vice-President said, there should be happy India, legally, socially, culturally, and IIPA has a very dominant role, he said. So, now IIPA should come out of that ivory tower of academic concentration only and give a little more emphasis to this and see what best can be done to advice the Government as to how nicely this Act can be implored. For example, in the last Commonwealth Games, those countries refused to come here to play unless Delhi was rid of animals/stray dogs. So, within one month, they did it and the registration started. So, we can also do it by providing for painless disposal of stray animals.</p>	<p>The Chairman during the meeting itself replied as:</p> <p>CHAIRMAN: Mr. Pai, you cannot expect IIPA to do everything for the country. The people who are at the helm of affairs in the Local Branch or the Regional Branch, they know better than the individual members as to who are the candidates and their capacity. So, they have recommended that the voting right should depend on the membership strength of the Branch. 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Item No.312.5 Removal of members in arrears for more than two years (2018 & 2019) from the roll of membership of the Institute.

Rule 35(1) of the MoA of the Institute provides that **`the name of any member whose subscription falls in arrears for more than two years shall be removed from the Roll of Members of the Institute unless the Executive Council decide otherwise`.**

As per our records, there are 17 Annual Members and 04 Corporate Members who have yet to renew their subscription in spite of efforts to persuade them to renew their subscription. We have sent two letters dated 6th February, 2019 and 26th June, 2019 to the Annual Members requesting them to renew their membership. As we have not received the membership subscription from these defaulting members, as such it is proposed that the names of such members may be removed from the roll of membership under Rule 35(1) of the Rules of the Institute. The list of defaulting Annual and Corporate Members is enclosed.

Further, several old Annual members had been requesting for conversion of their Annual Membership to Life membership. In view of the reduction in number of Life members as well as the fact that both Annual and Life members have same privileges and both are same in essence as they are voters also, the Chairman IIPA approved the conversion of existing Annual Members to Life Members subject to payment of Life membership fee along with pending dues of Annual membership fee of previous years, if any. This will not impact the moratorium on membership. Accordingly, letters were sent to all the 114 Annual Members to convert their Annual membership to Life membership, if they so desire, on payment of Life membership fee along with dues, if any. So far 52 Annual members have converted their membership to Life membership by remitting the necessary subscription.

As per the Balance-Sheet for the year 2018-19, there is a long term liability of Rs.97.76 Crore (mainly on account of actuarial value of Pension/Gratuity/Leave encashment). This is a serious situation. IIPA has to find ways and means of raising the resources for this purpose. For the start, we may request the Life Members to contribute Rs.1000/- per member to be kept in a Corpus fund to offset this liability partially. Afterwards, from the year 2019-20, the Life Members may deposit Rs.500/- per member and the amount would be kept in that Corpus Fund. The members who contribute this one time amount of Rs.1000/- and Rs.500/- per member afterwards, shall continue to be Life members and shall be entitled to all the privileges like voting right, hostel facility on member's rate as per rules and availability etc. Other options/solution will also be explored to augment this fund.
