<p>Director General IIPA requested the Chairman to express his thoughts and give his directions to IIPA.</p> <p>Dr Jitendra Singh, Chairman, IIPA Executive Council complimented Director General and entire team of IIPA for conducting 66 training programmes, 46 webinars and 60 research projects in the hard times of covid pandemic but expressed the concern that in spite of such hard work and efforts, IIPA is not getting the desired recognition and there is need for more inclusiveness and integration of IIPA with other organizations like DoPT (Training Division), ISTM, LBSNAA, CBC etc. The esteem of IIPA needs to be enhanced with wider spectrum of activities and outreach. IIPA should not be known as retired officers club and this notion needs to be changed by including more and more serving officers, academicians, professionals and corporates. Eminent people, domain experts may be invited as guest faculty or visiting faculty to IIPA. There are many journalist and media professionals who have expert knowledge of the working of the government and knowledge of different social, economic and</p>	<p>The suggestions of the Hon'ble Chairman have been noted and being complied with. IIPA is already collaborating with DoPT, DARPG, LBSNAA, ISTM, CBC, NCGG etc. with respect to training and research. IIPA has signed MOU with NCGG for collaboration in training and research activities. IIPA is also working with ATIs in the areas of training and research. With support from J-PAL, IIPA has done the FRACing of its faculty and employee and now helping different ministries and departments of Government of India for undertaking their FRACing activity.</p> <p>IIPA is now a Knowledge Partner in preparing the Vision India@2047 document for the Governance Group of Secretaries and assisting the Ministries/Departments in preparing the Vision document. Also, IIPA is assisting DoPT and DARPG in preparation of these departments' Vision@2047 document also.</p> <p>IIPA is partnering with CBC and DARPG in a big way on many issues like strengthening of CTIs and ATIs, Good Governance, Mentoring for Civil Services aspirants etc. In fact, IIPA has hosted a workshop of CTIs under the aegis of CBC on 26<sup>th</sup> August 2021 inaugurated by the</p>

<p>political aspects. Like media professionals, there are experts from different fields, industry who can be invited as guest faculty to IIPA. IIPA can work with Capacity Building Commission (CBC). Different ministries are approaching CBC for advisory, training etc. and IIPA can do the same work for the ministries. IIPA can also reach out to private sector. Big corporate sector like TATA, has their own TATA Administrative Service and they are now reforming it. IIPA can become Resource Hub for the government and corporate sector. In this way, the spectrum of IIPA will be widened. IIPA should coordinate more with LBSNAA and National Centre of Good Governance (NCGG) for the training programmes and research studies. NCGG is imparting training to civil servants of foreign countries and IIPA is also doing the same. So, these two institutes can coordinate. The Hon'ble Prime Minister of India has started the programme of placing the newly inducted IAS officers as Assistant Secretaries in the central ministries for 3 months before their placement in their respective cadres. This initiative is very successful and giving very good results. In the 3-month attachment, these IAS officers prepare presentations on flagship schemes of India and they present it before the Prime Minister. IIPA can also be part of this initiative and these IAS officers as Assistant Secretaries can have one-day attachment with IIPA. The membership has been reopened and the objective should be to include serving civil servants, professionals and people who are experts in their own fields and professionals. Chairman added that our Hon'ble Prime Minister is so much focused on governance reforms and simplifying the service delivery to the people. Chairman mentioned that there is a programme on starts-up and one participant said that he needs to go through so many licenses to start a new venture, 62 NOCs required for starting covid clinic etc. Chairman said that the</p>	<p>Hon'ble Minister and Chairman IIPA EC. IIPA has facilitated the next workshop organized by CBC on 12<sup>th</sup> October also and participated in regional conferences organized by DARPG later on. IIPA is now chairing a group of 06 CTIs to devise a strategy on sharing, collaboration and networking among CTIs.</p> <p>IIPA is consciously making efforts to rope in serving Civil Servants and academicians as members of IIPA and since reopening of membership, IIPA has granted membership to Civil Servants, Academicians and Professionals.</p> <p>IIPA has been inviting Subject Matter Experts as Guest Lecturers in its training programs and it will try to rope in professionals as well as experts used by other CTIs for its programs.</p> <p>IIPA has started using Social Media in a big way to enhance visibility and putting all its events and happenings on Social Media now.</p> <p>As per the suggestions of the Hon'ble Minister and Chairman EC, IIPA has been trying hard to induct serving officers as its members. The Hon'ble Minister has approved a total of 221 persons for admission to life membership of IIPA out of which, there are 18 serving IAS officers and 55 serving officers from other services. There are people from other walks of life also like Medical professional, Academicians, PSU professionals and others.</p>

<p>Hon'ble Prime Minister is focused to bring reform in this system of unnecessary licenses and steps involved. Now, technology will play a major role in very aspects of governance and life and government is promoting more and more technology enabled governance and decision-making. Technology and futuristic projects should be the focus of IIPA. In order to enhance the esteem of IIPA, consistency in its work is required. Chairman also emphasized that IIPA should use the social media channels to promote its work and visibility. Chairman also emphasized that there should be exclusion criteria and all the membership applications should be properly scrutinized.</p>	
<p>Shri Arun Kumar Rath, Chairman, Odisha Regional Branch said that serving officers and professionals should be given preference for membership. Eminent Subject matter experts from regional and local branches having the desired and relevant knowledge should be chosen by IIPA to become visiting faculty in the training programmes of IIPA Delhi. IIPA should collaborate with regional and local branches in training and researched programmes. The training and research programmes which IIPA Delhi thinks that can be done by any regional branches should be either outsourced or the branches should be included appropriately. He informed that Odisha Regional Branch is involved in local resource mobilization, but IIPA Delhi may increase the grants given to branches.</p>	<p>IIPA is organizing webinars on flagship programs in collaboration with Regional Branches. Director, LBNSAA said that LBSNAA will coordinate more with IIPA as suggested by Chairman and both the institutes will explore the areas of coordination. 4. Recently 37 applicants have been granted Life membership received from Chhattisgarh and efforts are being made to establish a Regional Branch in Chhattisgarh.

Director General IIPA requested the Chairman to express his thoughts and give his directions to IIPA.

Dr Jitendra Singh, Chairman, IIPA Executive Council complimented Director General and entire team of IIPA for conducting 66 training programmes, 46 webinars and 60 research projects in the hard times of covid pandemic but expressed the concern that in spite of such hard work and efforts, IIPA is not getting the desired recognition and there is need for more inclusiveness and integration of IIPA with other organizations like DoPT (Training Division), ISTM, LBSNAA, CBC etc. The esteem of IIPA needs to be enhanced with wider spectrum of activities and outreach. IIPA should not be known as retired officers club and this notion needs to be changed by including more and more serving officers, academicians, professionals and corporates. Eminent people, domain experts may be invited as guest faculty or visiting faculty to IIPA. There are many journalist and media professionals who have expert knowledge of the working of the government and knowledge of different social, economic and political aspects. Like media professionals, there are experts from different fields, industry who can be invited as guest faculty to IIPA. IIPA can work with Capacity Building Commission (CBC). Different ministries are approaching CBC for advisory, training etc. and IIPA can do the same work for the ministries. IIPA can also reach out to private sector. Big corporate sector like TATA, has their own TATA Administrative Service and they are now reforming it. IIPA can become Resource Hub for the government and corporate sector. In this way, the spectrum of IIPA will be widened. IIPA should coordinate more with LBSNAA and National Centre of Good Governance (NCGG) for the training programmes and research studies. NCGG is imparting training to civil servants of foreign countries and IIPA is also doing the same. So, these two institutes can coordinate. The Hon'ble Prime Minister of India has started the programme of placing the newly inducted IAS officers as Assistant Secretaries in the central ministries for 3 months before their placement in their respective cadres. This initiative is very successful and giving very good results. In the 3-month attachment, these IAS officers prepare presentations on flagship schemes of India and they present it before the Prime Minister. IIPA can also be part of this initiative and these IAS officers as Assistant Secretaries can have one-day attachment with IIPA. The membership has been reopened and the objective should be to include serving civil servants, professionals and people who are experts in their own fields and professionals. Chairman added that our Hon'ble Prime Minister is so much focused on governance reforms and simplifying the service delivery to the people. Chairman mentioned that there is a programme on starts-up and one participant said that he needs to go through so many licenses to start a new venture, 62 NOCs required for starting covid clinic etc. Chairman said that the Hon'ble Prime Minister is focused to bring reform in this system of unnecessary licenses and steps involved. Now, technology will play a major role in very aspects of governance and life and government is promoting more and more technology enabled governance and decision-making. Technology and futuristic projects should be the focus of IIPA. In order to enhance the esteem of IIPA, consistency in its work is required. Chairman also emphasized that IIPA should use the social media channels to promote its work and visibility. Chairman also emphasized that there should be exclusion criteria and all the membership applications should be properly scrutinized.

Shri Arun Kumar Rath, Chairman, Odisha Regional Branch said that serving officers and professionals should be given preference for membership. Eminent Subject matter experts from

regional and local branches having the desired and relevant knowledge should be chosen by IIPA to become visiting faculty in the training programmes of IIPA Delhi. IIPA should collaborate with regional and local branches in training and researched programmes. The training and research programmes which IIPA Delhi thinks that can be done by any regional branches should be either outsourced or the branches should be included appropriately. He informed that Odisha Regional Branch is involved in local resource mobilization, but IIPA Delhi may increase the grants given to branches.

Shri Yogesh Suri (representing CEO, NITI Aayog) seconded the suggestions of the Chairman and other members of the EC.

Shri Satbir Singh, Maharashtra Regional Branch appreciated the idea of inclusion of more serving officers and professionals as new members. He suggested that senior serving officials in Central and State Government, Universities etc. may be given the status of ex-officio members of the IIPA. He informed that Maharashtra Regional Branch is encouraging innovations in government and awarding Rs 10000/- to the officers who are promoting innovations in their work.

Shri Srinivas R. Katikithala, Director, Lal Bahadur Shastri National Academy of Administration (LBSNAA) had one minor observation that the Paul Appleby Award for Academic Excellence may be renamed. Director General, IIPA informed that it will be renamed, and members were requested to give suggestions of names. Director, LBNSAA said that LBSNAA will coordinate more with IIPA as suggested by Chairman and both the institutes will explore the areas of coordination. DG IIPA suggested that new joining probationers in LBSNAA may be asked to take the membership of IIPA so that from the very beginning of their career in government, they will be members of IIPA and can contribute more for its development.

Smt Rashmi Chaudhary, Additional Secretary, DoPT (representing Secretary, DoPT) has said that IIPA got its Peer review done and the findings of the review may be sent to DoPT. Director General, IIPA informed that NILERD (organization under NITI Aayog and Shri Yogesh Suri is the Director General of NILERD) has done the PEER Review Report was already placed before the members in the last EC meeting. However, the findings will be presented to the EC in the next meeting. Chairman IIPA said Smt Rashmi Chaudhary to give more focus to IIPA and get involved in the activities and functioning of IIPA.

Shri V. Padmanabhan, Dy. Secretary, Dept. of Exp. (Representing Secretary (Exp.) has raised three issues: 1) Efforts taken by IIPA to increase the revenue of the institute, 2) How IIPA is focusing on the North-East and 3) Contribution of the branches of IIPA in revenue mobilization. Director General, IIPA informed that there are regional branches of IIPA in every northeastern state and efforts are on to open new Regional Branches in Sikkim and Tripura. He further added that the branches do not contribute to the revenue mobilization of IIPA and rather branches are financially supported by IIPA Delhi. However, the branches should do more efforts towards revenue-mobilisation and try to be self-sufficient. DG IIPA also informed that in spite of covid and less revenue from training programmes, IIPA has been able to reduce the deficit and several economy measures were taken for managing the expenditure of the institute. Chairman said that IIPA should sensitize the representatives of the branches and there should be more close

and small group meetings in order to develop more linkages and coordination with branches. DG IIPA informed that IIPA has started webinars on the flagship schemes of the Govt. of India with the regional branches from January 2021 with 02 webinars each month. The Regional branches have been involved in organizing the webinars and all the Regional/Local branches are invited to participate in the Webinars.

Dr. R.K. Suresh Kumar, Chairman, Kerala Regional Branch supported the suggestions of Chairman, IIPA Executive Council for increasing and widening the spectrum of IIPA. Dr Kumar informed the efforts of Kerala Regional Branch in spreading awareness through programmes during Covid in Kerala. Dr Kumar said that those experts involved in policy studies and implementation may be given preference for membership.

Prof. N. Lokendra Singh, Chairman, Manipur Regional Branch said that next EC meeting should be in-person meeting in Delhi and members may attend personally. DG IIPA informed that all the members are welcome to attend EC meeting or any other programme of IIPA physically in Delhi.

Shri Shekhar Dutt, Hon'ble Member said that IIPA should collaborate with national and international institutions and should work on coordinating with DoPT, LBSNAA, Capacity Building Commission (CBC) as suggested by Chairman, IIPA.

Shri S.N. Tripathi, Director General, IIPA thanked Chairman and Members of Executive Council. DG IIPA said that membership is not limited to retired civil servants and its open to all the serving officers, professionals. DG IIPA said that Shri Ashish Kumar, IAS from Tamil Nadu cadre and PS to Hon'ble Minister of DoPT is serving officer and became the member of IIPA. DG IIPA said that IIPA will use for social media platforms as suggested by Chairman, IIPA for increasing the visibility of IIPA. DG IIPA thanked Chairman, IIPA and Director, LBSNAA for exploring the opportunity to induct new probationers of IAS and other services to become members of IIPA and engaging with DoPT Training Division for one day attachment of the Assistant Secretaries in IIPA. DG IIPA also said that IIPA will explore the suggestion of engaging professionals, scientific personnel, defence personnel etc. as visiting or guest faculty in the programmes of IIPA.

**Report of the Peer Review of Indian Institute of Public Administration (IIPA)**

**Findings**

- The Institute has been successful in promoting and providing for the study of Public Administration and Economic and Political Science by undertaking courses, research studies, training, conferences/seminars and collaborative tie-ups with other institutions especially for public administrators and other officials of the government machinery at all levels i.e. centre, state and district.
- The Institute has been publishing journals, periodicals, newsletter, research papers and books to promote the study of public administration.
- The Institute has been successful in its objective to establish and maintain libraries and information services to facilitate the study of public administration and spreading information in regard thereto.
- Fulfilling its objective to constitute or cause to be constituted Regional Branches at convenient centers in India to promote the objects of the society, IIPA as on 31st March 2020, has 24 Regional branches and 43 Local Branches.
- The Institute collaborates with number of national and international organizations for the purposes of helping the cause of public administration.
- The Institute is fully equipped with requisite infrastructure and makes continuous investments in upgrading its infrastructure with changing scenario.
- The institute is fully resourced with the manpower required to perform its mandates. The total staff strength of the institute was 269 of which the majorities were under the project mode.
- It has been found that the institute is having a greater share of non-technical staff including the support staff among the total regular employees. The proportion of faculty is much less (just 17 percent of the total employees are faculty) as compared with the other categories of staff. However, it has a vast network of Visiting/Guest faculty which are engaged regularly for delivering lectures as also providing assistance to various Research Studies. The Visiting/Guest faculty are usually Serving/Retired. Civil Servants as well as Academicians. In addition, for assistance in Research studies, IIPA regularly recruits academic staff like Research Officers/Research Associates/Research assistants on short term contract basis. As such, there seems to be no shortage of faculty at IIPA.
- The institute receives grants from Department of Personnel and Training, Ministry of Personnel, Public Grievances and Pensions, Government of India. Apart from grant received from DoPT, the institute also receives funds from Ministry of Housing and Urban Affairs, Ministry of Consumer Affairs, and other ministries/organizations.

- The institute is able to generate substantial income through its own activities that include Fee from various fee-based and sponsored training programmes, user charges, research assignments, membership subscription, sale of publications and others.
- Around 80% of internal revenue is generated from various fee-based and sponsored training programmes, while user charges and net income from research assignments contribute around 16.7% of internal revenue of the institute.
- The financial resources generated by the Institute have seen steady increase from 2017-18 to 2019-20.
- Although the institute uses the revenue generated through internal sources to meet its expenditure, but it is not enough to meet all the expenses leading to a deficit situation.
- The Institute's internal revenue generation as a percent of expenditure was 62.89% in 2017-18, 51.68% in 2018-19 and 57.52% in 2019-20.
- The Academic Centres of IIPA perform a crucial role in research and training activities of the Institute.
- It has been observed that IIPA has achieved 133 % of its target in research activities in 2017-18. The corresponding percentages for 2018-19 and 2019-20 were 114% and 107 % respectively.
- It has been found that IIPA has achieved 132 % of its target in training activities in 2017-18. The corresponding percentages for 2018-19 and 2019-20 were 119% and 121 % respectively.
- The institute had 90 publications during the reference period, with maximum 42.22% books (reports/monographs/handbooks) being printed.
- During the reference period the institute had 12 collaborations with other organizations at national and international level.
- The activities of the institute have influenced public policy in Recommendation of Administrative Reform Commission, MSME Policies, Policies of Ministry of Tribal Affairs and Gender Issues of Ministry of Women and Child Development.
- Some of the challenges faced by the Institute in performing its responsibilities include Very Old Infrastructure, Building, Small Campus and Lack of space for sporting facilities.
- The institute is involved in capacity development of international and national administrators and policy makers. IIPA's role in the field of public administrations needs to be acknowledged.
- The institute is working towards expanding its activities to strengthen their presence nationally and globally. They are constantly upgrading their infrastructure and skills of faculty in line with changing scenario. Faculty is given opportunities not only to participate in the national events in this field but also to visit abroad on various forums.

### Way Forward

- As the institute has been able to achieve its objectives and has been keeping up with technological changes, it is recommended to strengthen the existing systems and processes of the institute so that it can continue its activities more efficiently and effectively.  
Apart from the Administrative Staff college in Hyderabad, no other institute is conducting activities similar to the institute. Thus, the institute is a standalone type of institution that cannot be merged with another institute. Expansion of its activities may be considered.
- More than 55 percent of the regular staff of the institute are non-technical and support staff, however, it is heartening to note that earlier, the percentage of regular staff in non-technical/support category was much high and the institute has taken several measures to reduce this percentage like: Outsourcing of Services like Security, Housekeeping and Campus Maintenance, Strict moratorium on appointment of Group "C" and "D" staff and making only contractual appointments presently.
- Consultancy can be a major source of revenue generation for the Institute. The institute has not undertaken any consultancy during the three-year period under review. The institute is able to generate large revenue on its own. However, the major activities of the institute are affected by external factors, for example government has made bidding mandatory for award of research studies, thus despite being technically sound, an institute may not get the study due to financial reasons thus, 100% self -sufficiency cannot be reached by the institute. The present system of grant may be continued by DoPT.
