The Committee considered the activities reports received from following 16 Regional and 11 Local Branches. As per the criteria, the Committee reviewed the performance of the Branches. The Committee observed as under:

The Branch has been trying to tie up with ASKI and they have agreed to sponsor three fellowships for the Jammu & Kashmir Regional branch.</p> <p>The Branch had organised Webinar on Pradhan Mantri Fasal Bima Yojna with the help of IIPA Hq. and it seems that there has been not much participation of the field functionaries from the concerned department stakeholders. So extra efforts to be put and make these webinars more useful and relevant to them for how to further improve upon the schemes. Some evaluation studies could be taken up for them based upon the Parliamentary Standing Committee reports or any other report which we can take forward. The Branch seeks guidance and assistance from the IIPA as to how to make these interactions more relevant.</p> <p>The Branch had sent around 73 applications for life membership and IIPA has been kind enough to have already approved 53 applications and other 20 applications may be approved early.
